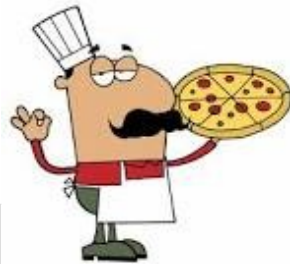

The March meeting was preceded by the Annual Parish Meeting where the Chairman reported on Council's actions for the last year and parishioners raised the issues of: the Appeal by Dale View Quarry against the rejection of 2 No Wire Saws, request for 2 further grit bins, Quarry lorry disregard for the right of way at Pilhough cross-roads and dogs off leads attacking sheep in Stanton Lees. PCSO Grundy attended the meeting and is supplying "Dogs on Leads" notices and noted that the Derbyshire Alert phone and text service is discontinued but email will continue.

Councillors discussed the proposed Environment Agency drop-in session, noted that playground repairs were planned for the following day and received the accounts for the year and reports on the Stanton Moor Minerals and Enthoven liaison groups. On Planning issues they had no objections to a Stanton Lees application to DDDC and are objecting to the appeal for the 2 Wire Saws proposed at Dale View Quarry.

***COUNCIL ELECTIONS*** will be held on 7<sup>th</sup> May. If you wish to stand to become one of Seven councillors in the three Wards please note that nomination forms are available online at Derbyshire Dales website and the closing date for submission is **9<sup>th</sup> April 2015 by 4pm at Matlock Town Hall.**

We currently have only 4 of the 5 existing councillors who may decide to stand again and will be pleased if you will give consideration to serving your parish as democracy is best served when we run at the full strength of 7. The nomination forms require only two electors to propose you and must be hand delivered to Matlock Town Hall where the officers will go through the forms with you to ensure they are correct. Stanton is divided into 3 wards comprising 5 councillors in Stanton in Peak, 1 in Stanton Lees and 1 in Warren Carr.
