The July meeting was pleased to host an update by Jane Newman Snr Minerals Officer PDNPA and Tony Favell PDNPA Member on the working quarries with special reference to the state of play with the ROMP for Stanton Moor which awaits a 19th August deadline for more information requested by PDNPA before consideration. A useful question and answer session followed.

STANTON PARISH COUNCIL - continued

PC Ian Hyde introduced himself to the meeting and noted that this was only his 3rd visit in his 10 months as our area Policeman due to the minimal levels of crime. His patch covers all the villages of his predecessor but is now also responsible for Tideswell and Bakewell. Council was very pleased to see a large parish turnout for the Dale View Wire Saw application at the PDNPA Planning Committee which was unfortunately unable to be discussed due to a missing statutory consultation so will return to the August or September committee. The first Stanton Moor Quarrying Liaison Group meeting was attended by Cllr Morris and provided useful dialogue. The next meeting will be held later in the day to reduce work conflicts for the voluntary body membership. Efforts to improve signage from Highways are being hampered by their departmental cuts. In these current times of cost cutting amongst public bodies it will probably come as no surprise that our local police station at Bakewell is a potential target.

After the recent and sudden closure of the police office at Bradwell there are concerns, widely felt, that Bakewell is next.

The Chief Constable is to make a statement regarding its future later this year but it is my belief that unless we make our feelings heard now we will be dealt a fait accompli and be given no opportunity for a public consultation.

For this reason I have distributed a petition around various locations in Bakewell and in less than 2 weeks have obtained in excess of 1000 signatures in favour of retaining the police station with its current quota of staff as opposed to having Bakewell and surrounding villages covered by officers from Matlock.

The petition is still circulating and I would encourage everyone who encounters it to sign it in order to make our voices heard.

I am hoping to get the petition online in the near future.

As you are all no doubt aware Bakewell provides police cover for many villages as far afield as Hartington and Hathersage and as the major town in one of the most visited National Parks in the world it is almost impossible to believe that Derbyshire Police are considering closing it as a cost cutting measure. The cost in terms of rising crime figures and police response times, should a closure go ahead, would be immeasurable.

The idea that officers parading on and off at Matlock would be able to provide the same service to our community as is currently received is at best ridiculous and at worst a lie.

Bakewell has been deprived of staff over recent years and appears to be the poor relation of both the district and the force. The plan to run it down even more so that when total closure is announced the justification could be given that no-one had worked out of it for months is both underhand and unfair to the community it espouses to serve.

Therefore the purpose of the petition is to prompt a full public consultation BEFORE any decision is made rather than presenting the closure as a fait accompli.

If you are in favour of supporting this petition please make your feelings known to the Police and Crime Commissioner Alan Charles. We may be rural but we're not without a voice! Sandra Wetton.

The Newark Room of All Saints' Church Bakewell

The Parish Church has been lent an extensive collection of dolls, dolls houses and toys for an exhibition in the Newark in aid of the Roof Appeal Fund. It will be an opportunity to see this unique collection which dates from late Victorian times through to the 1930's.

The exhibition is all of English dolls, dolls houses and toys, from a simple Victorian plain fronted house for the lower end of the market to more elaborate styles with staircases and beautifully turned balustrading to verandas and balconies. There is a house that was especially made for Hamleys and one that is a model of the Little House at Windsor given to Princesses Elizabeth on her sixth birthday by the people of Wales.

Almost all English dolls houses were made by G&J Lines, Lines Brothers or Triang. The dolls are all soft character dolls made by Chad Valley, Deans Rag Book, Norah Wellings, and Merrythought – among them one depicting Princess Elizabeth; one a Mabel Lucy Attwell character and one Sonja Henie, Olympic ice skating gold medallist who became a film star. The toys include a Punch & Judy theatre, a gypsy caravan, a Triang shop and a Triang water cart.


