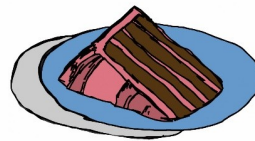

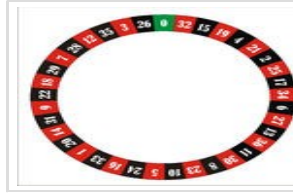
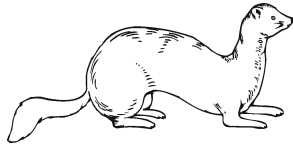

STANTON IN PEAK PARISH COUNCIL

The Parish Council held its final meeting on 22nd April to formally agree the accounts ready for audit, comment on planning and receive reports and payments to date.

A report was received from Council attendance at the Appeal for the Wire Saws at Dale View Quarry that noted the thoroughness of the Inspector's factual questioning and that a decision will be made in approximately one month's time.

Council received only two nominations by the election deadline and whilst Stanton Lees Ward will be filled on 7th May, only one member out of five will represent Stanton in Peak Ward and not the one for Warren Carr Ward. Consequently with only two Councillors the Parish is inquorate and the Monitor Officer from Derbyshire Dales District Council will have to call a further poll which will probably not take place until June to fill the 5 vacancies. Please consider standing for your parish council, information on the date of the next poll will be published as soon as we receive it.

The Derbyshire Federation for Mental Health a locally based Mental Health Charity has secured funding from Lloyds Bank Foundation and Comic Relief to fund a Telephone Support Service for individuals living with mild/moderate mental health conditions.

The service began in April 2014 and provides the opportunity to access support via a weekly phone call (for up to 12 weeks) from a trained mental health support worker. This service offers support to individuals who due to the lower threshold of their mental ill health are often unable to access statutory and other services. During the telephone support individuals can for example be supported to address their feelings of loneliness and social isolation. They are encouraged to talk over their issues and anxieties and are supported to develop strategies and coping mechanisms. In addition individuals may be signposted to other organisations and agencies where appropriate. Referrals can be made by health professionals or by self-referral.
