





Stanton In Peak Holy Trinity Church - How will you vote?

I am writing this shortly after the announcement of a snap general election at the beginning of June. It has often been said that religion and politics should not be mixed, but I disagree. The work of politicians affects the lives of us all, and so I believe that all people of goodwill should seek to be aware of the work our politicians are doing and should use their influence in legitimate ways where they can.

Christianity has always taught that 'loving our neighbour as ourselves' means acting in support of those who are treated unjustly, and speaking out on behalf of those unable to speak for themselves.
