Wednesday 8th October at 7.30pm.





Defibrillators in Stanton and Stanton Lees

A small group met up and discussed the possibilities of having defibrillators in Stanton and Stanton Lees. If a resident, or someone passing through, had a heart attack - having a defibrillator in the village could save a life... surely that is worth investing in!

We have learnt the following from the Community Heartbeat Trust and British Heart Foundation:

- following a cardiac arrest the chances of survival decrease by 23% per minute;
- it is very important that medical treatment starts as soon as possible;
- the UK Resuscitation Council suggests a defibrillator should be
- available wherever medical treatment is more than 5 minutes away and
- following sudden cardiac arrest, the survival rates with cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR) are 20%: with a defibrillator the rates are 50%.

The defibrillator needs to be kept in a special cabinet with a source of electricity to keep it constantly charged and to keep it above freezing. It will be locked for security, so a code will be known by residents and visitors will be given directions to it and the code following a 999 call to the Ambulance Service.

The machine is simple to use and gives you clear, concise instructions, so training is not required. It does not require a rota of trained first aiders. Awareness and training can be provided to give people confidence in using it.

Initially we would like to install a defibrillator in both Stanton and Stanton Lees. If we can raise enough funds we would propose to install an additional defibrillator in Stanton.

- The Community Heartbeat Trust (CHT) is a charity set up to support local communities provide Community Access Defibrillators. They can provide advice about the best defibrillator for a local community depending on location etc. They provide a total package for £2000 per defibrillator. This includes information and advice, installation including box, maintenance, liaison with local ambulance service and awareness training. They also provide access to grant giving bodies towards the cost, and a free bespoke bank account for depositing donations and funds.
- We can also apply to British Heart Foundation for a grant.

If every adult in Stanton in Peak parish were to donate whatever amount they wished to – we could turn this life saving idea into a reality.

STANTON PARISH COUNCIL NEWS

At the September meeting held in Stanton Lees Chapel the Council discussed the Application for determination of conditions for Stanton Moor Quarry—which if all information is supplied gives the Quarry Operator the right to work the quarry again. Council was clear in its message that this quarry should not be reopened and noted omissions in the papers received that indicated the company could send laden vehicles down through the village in certain circumstances.

Other matters included highways and footpath issues and play equipment maintenance.

It has received several worthy requests for funds notably including a village defibrillator which it will consider at the precept setting meeting on 18th November at Stanton in Peak Village Hall.


